Andy Briggs, designer at Spaceslide. Crittall-inspired steel-framed glazed doors are a smart choice for both period properties and new projects. Their thin black profile adds an urban, industrial feel and the doors are ideal for separating a hallway from the main living room or sectioning off a sleeping area while allowing light to flow between spaces.

HIDDEN TALENTS

Sliding doors make great room dividers for open-plan spaces and can be particularly useful as a space-saving option, since they don't project into the room when open. Sliding, folding and pocket doors are all versatile, flexible choices and come in timber, glass or painted finishes. 'Glazed doors can create a partition between two living areas. Go for ultra-thin frames that allow the doors to be virtually invisible when open,' advises Gary Davis, director at IQ Glass.

'Traditional doors have a dead zone of unused space in the arc where they swing a open. Pocket doors give back that space and can open up possibilities for alternative layouts. Single pocket doors are a space-saving choice for bathrooms, en suites or utility rooms. Double and telescopic pocket doors are perfect for closing off open-plan spaces with ease. Top-hung frames allow for a continuous floor surface between rooms, for a seamless look,' says Caroline Clarkson at Eclipse.
